The matter is taken up by the Single Bench pursuant to the order contained in the Notification No. 638-WBAT/2J-15/2016 (Pt.-II) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 issued in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 5(6) of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

Mr. Mishra, learned counsel files copies of the following judgment:

- (i) "Mr. Raj Dip Ray v. Mr. Joytosh Majumder & Mr. Sanjib Das" reported in WPST 170 of 2014 order dated 09.07.2014,
- (ii) "Kartic alias Kartick Biswas v. The State of West Bengal & Ors." (OA 40 of 2019) order dated 05.07.2022.

Let the copies of the judgments kept on record.

Mr. Mishra, learned counsel supporting the claim of the applicant for his father being having served under regular establishment shows copy of the PPO in which the total length of qualifying service has been shown to be 23 years 7 months and 19 days. Mr. Mishra is of the view that from such length of the service, it can be assumed that the deceased employee was neither a temporary worker nor under any work charged establishment, rather served under regular establishment. Further, the family of the deceased employee enjoys family pension which is another way to assume that the deceased employee was under regular establishment. Further, the deceased employee used to enjoy all the benefits like leave, medical, pay scale etc. like that of any regular employee.

Heard the submissions of learned counsels of both the sides at length.

Pleadings are complete.
